have this in place so that in October of this year we will have a plan in place or we will have some kind of way of doing this, and it says right in the fiscal note the upgrading of the state computer system will not be completed until January of 2001. So what are we going to be doing for the next year and a half to implement this? It bothers me very much that the Health and Human Services Department is telling me that, no problem, we'll be able to do this; there's not going to be any problem at all and we will be able to implement this in an easy way. I don't think there's anything easy about this. I...I'm concerned about the checks. I know that Mr. Tesar in...who is clerk of the circuit court...district court in Douglas County, tells me that one of his biggest problems are bad checks. What are we going to do even if wages are taken out if there's no...if there's no money there, if something has happened and that there's no money there? I don't...I'm not sure I understand how in two days all of this can be resolved. I'm very concerned about the whole situation. I resent the federal government and what they're trying to do to our children and our custodial parents and would urge everyone to think carefully about this bill. Something has to be done to improve the bill and somehow assurance has to be given, at least to me, that this is an implementation that is possible in my lifetime. And I...I would...I would urge you not to vote for the bracket until next year, but possibly we could bracket it and try to work on it off the floor so that we could improve this. And I see that Senator Beutler has quite a few amendments on it and Senator Bohlke has an amendment and there are other people with amendments. I would urge everyone to look at those carefully. I...I have only talked to Senator Brown maybe 45 seconds on this bill. She didn't have time to assure me. I've talked with the Health and Human Services Department and they have tried to assure me, but I am still not...not convinced that this is the way, and some kind of plan has to be initiated so that I can feel some kind of comfort level with how these...these...the people that are court ordered to receive these funds are going to receive them in a timely fashion. Thank you, Mr. President.
