or not or how they...how they did the...how that study, that's not part of this yellow folder that we have here. But it looks like there's lots of questions still up in the air and I'll still, you know, will be thinking about whether we should bracket, or maybe the time of bracketing is too long, or maybe we should follow the extent, I think that Senator Beutler's looking at, line by line, and maybe make changes in that. But still...still haven't...still thinking about it and so I'd turn the rest of my time over to Senator (microphone not activated), if he so desires.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Members of the Legislature, I think we ought to bracket this bill. I've talked to a county attorney, at least one. There are others with similar problems. If this thing, LB 637, is put into place, there are people who are going to be hauled in to court for not having paid child support who should not be hauled there. Some are going to go to jail when they should not. We know this in advance right now, and those who are in the enforcement end are telling us this. So why does the Legislature, in advance of the fact, want to put in place a bad law which is going to have people dragged into court who should not be there and then put in jail who should not be in jail. Now I don't know why a county attorney is going to lie to me and say things like that. I believe them. I can read. Now if this bracket motion does not go, you all are the ones who are going to go through it line by line. I'm not going to offer an amendment. I might have some fun yackety-yakking with you about it, but it's going to stay just as bad as it is as far as I'm concerned. The way to show how irresponsible the Legislature is, and Senator Kristensen cannot get the Legislature out from under this by talking about the federal government, put the bad law in place that the Legislature enacted and then we should receive the contempt and anger of the populace because we do not have to pass bad legislation. Even the Nebraska Supreme Court cannot order us to pass a specific bill. We cannot get out from under our responsibility. And if we think what the federal government is doing so bad...is so bad, we should exercise our prerogatives and discharge our responsibilities by not enacting bad legislation into law.
