PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Price, on the motion to bracket LB 637.

SENATOR PRICE: Thank you, members of the body. I was finally pleased to hear someone speak about the children, the mothers and the children. I've heard about losses of position in the district, the clerk of the district court, and the people that handle the monies and how the government is going to fine us and all of this, but nobody, until Senator Kiel, had mentioned the children and I am so pleased to finally hear that this is the focus of this child support bill. It is flawed. I'm having real trouble with it and I'm leaning towards the motion to bracket. And I yield the remainder of my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam Price. And I would like to extend my condolences to "Baroness" Tyson, not condolences, congratulations. And I didn't have an opportunity to come back there yet and express my feelings because I'm kind of tied up in this unpleasant work but, Mrs. Tyson, before you get away, I hope to be able to come back and have a word or two with you about the "Baron". Anyway, we can vote this bracket motion just as it's presented. The Speaker, exercising his prerogatives, could determine to put it back on the agenda, but you can vote down the bracket motion if you choose. But you cannot offer more than one bracket motion in a day, if I understand things correctly. You can look it up and see. Now, there could probably be a unanimous consent motion to bracket and maybe that would go, but I'm not of a mind to get involved in all of this back and forth that is going to take place because the bill never should have gotten out of committee. Is the "Silver Fox" on the floor, meaning Senator Brashear, the Chairperson of the Judiciary Committee? I think I see him. I hope somebody will turn on a light because we may not be able to finish this colloquy. Senator Connealy, do you have any more time? Thank you very much, my friend. Senator Brashear, some of the people in this general area were wondering why the committee didn't do some amending when Senator Beutler said that the bill ought to be gone through point by point and so forth.
