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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Members of the Legislature, I want some things in the record because, in case the Legislature gets weak in the knees, I want it clear that I had no part to play in the devastation that is going to befall women and their children. On the one hand, people are saying the federal government is going to withhold money and hurt these women and children. If that's the government's position, let them take it. You put this in place and those women and children, because of the snafus, the tie-ups, and the general incompetency, they're not going to get it, their money, but then it's going to be your fault because you did it. But here is what I'm still looking at on page 4, and it's Senator Brown's favorite constituency--the big businesses. Now, in making it easy for Union Pacific to have one place to send these checks, there's nothing that would place liability on Union Pacific if they mess up and don't put enough information, when they send that money, to make it clear who the recipient is. The woman doesn't get the money. The worker, whose wages have been withheld, are both getting the short end of the stick, but the worker can wind up going to court and in jail and the company is scot-free because Senator Brown and the rest of you all are more interested in making it convenient for Union Pacific than you are in being sure that these women and families continue to get their money. I bet Senator Brown would be opposed to an insertion in this bill of a provision holding any company liable for any damage done to any person as a result of their failure to get the information to that central registry that ought to be gotten there. And I use the term "registry" on purpose because, as Senator Crosby was pointing out, you all's HHS hasn't done a good job. How about that sexual offenders or child abusers' registry where they had all kind of people on there who should not be on there? That's the example of how they function. They should not be on that registry, but they're there, and anybody who checks it out to see who those people are who are doing these terrible things will find innocent people's name on it. And these are the same people you want to turn this activity over to. I say again, when time comes for us to take action that might either protect women and children or advance their interests, we won't do that. People are talking about their fear of the federal government. Okay, they're scared of that. I can understand it because they're scared of everything.
