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They're scared of lobbyists. But that doesn't justify doing things that will hurt those whose interests we are supposed to protect and look out for. I hear in other contexts discussions of the vulnerability of single-parent families and the children in those families. Then we come to this juncture and I see the Legislature or some of my colleagues in that Legislature saying it doesn't matter that the current system works. You've got to junk that to do what the federal government said do, even if...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that means harming women and children. And as for...maybe I'm a "techniphobe". As for young "technicrat" Senator Jon Bruning, I want him to know that Senator Tyson wasn't quite right. They did not use a quill pen and write things out on parchment when I first came here. They hadn't even discovered writing yet. And we did things by barter because there was no such thing as money. They asked me how many pork chops or ham hocks I would accept for having served down here in this Legislature. That's the way that went. But I'll tell you what. I learned from coming through those very hard times that there were women and children facing harder times than I did, and I will not flippantly and casually throw those women and children to the wolves as this bill would have us do.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the motion to bracket LB 637, Senator Kiel.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. Members of the Legislature, I was looking at a letter that I got from the YWCA talking about this particular bill and they're talking about the fact that if it's not in place by October 1st we'll lose money allotted to help collect the child support payments and might lose some 60 million more which helps underwrite financial assistance to needy parents and children. And I will kind of go back over what I said a little bit earlier, hopefully without coughing through it, and that is I don't know if anybody else sees the illogic in this whole process whereby the federal government is saying we're here to help you, and perhaps that's illogical too, but we're here to help poor women and children or primarily poor women and children with child support. We're
