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SENATOR PRICE: Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the body, I yield my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam Price. Members of the Legislature, I hope you're observing how I conduct myself when I'm dealing with a bill on which I said I was going to do nothing, so you better hope a bill does not come along when I threaten to do something. But we're not on the bill itself. If you read that bill, you're going to see, provided that you understand what it's staying, how difficult it would be to rewrite that thing. If you're insistent on how bracketing it, pass it the way that it is. The geniuses put this together--Wusk and his partners, HHS and the federal government. Give them what they ask for and the quicker this damage that must come befalls the women and children, the quicker we can take corrective action. If you try to mitigate this damage so that it takes time before the true impact is felt, it will be like one of those insidious diseases whose symptoms do not manifest themselves in all of their savagery at the early stages, so there's a tendency to enter a stage of denial and refuse to recognize that you may have the beginnings of a life-threatening disease. Then, by the time it reaches the point where it can no longer be ignored, it is too late. Surgery will not help. Chemotherapy will not help. Radiation will not help. Nat "King" Cole, one of the best singers, in my opinion, whoever wrapped his pipes around music, went for a checkup because it was suspected that he had cancer. He had waited so long, and he was a heavy smoker, when they opened him up, they just sewed him right back together again. There was absolutely nothing that could be done. What the Legislature might be thinking about doing is putting something in place that will satisfy the federal government in total disregard of the harm done to these people who are to be the beneficiaries of all of this child support collection system, and they are the ones who are going to be hurt. If there is excruciating pain at the very beginning, then maybe we will be sensitized enough to do something to correct it in disregard of what the federal government tells us. I will get calls from you all's districts as I get right now, and I don't...I'm not offended by these women calling me trying to get help. I'm offended at the
