SENATOR COORDSEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a call of the house.

SENATOR COORDSEN: A call of the house has been requested. All in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those who are not in the Chamber and who are not excused, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call.
