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disbursement unit based on a RFP to anyone who responds to that RFP in a favorable way. There have been assertions on the floor that there is some sort of a deal already that's been done with Lockheed Martin, which is a private company, that contracts with some other states. That is absolutely not the case. The amendment that you have before you has the State Treasurer that would do the collection and disbursement. The third option is that some other state...some states have entered into agreements with the vigor...counties within their state to do the centralized collection and disbursement that...right now Douglas County employs 30 individuals to do the collection and disbursement of child support within Douglas County. They already have the system, so that Douglas County might be the contractor for this service. But the amendment that you have before you would have the State Treasurer receipt the payments. The reason that there's a difference in the "shall enter into a cooperative agreement with the State Treasurer" is that the State Treasurer would be the receptor, for sure, of the payments, but there could be the possibility of contracts with either the State Treasurer, other governmental entities, to do the disbursement, to operate the unit. The State Treasurer is concerned that this money is state money, and that if they were not responsible for receipting it, it would set a bad precedent. I believe that this money is the money of the families and I don't really see that it sets a precedent, but I can see some advantages from an organizational standpoint to having the State Treasurer be involved in the receipting. But that is the difference between the "shall" and "may". They would definitely be responsible for the receipting of it, but there may be another contractual arrangements...arrangement for the dispersing of the funds. So with that, I would yield the rest of my time and be glad to answer questions about the mechanism and try to get a sense of the will of the body in terms of the issues around privatization, whether you absolutely want it, for sure, with the State Treasurer. Whether you would...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...be willing to entertain other governmental entities, such as counties that are currently doing a big portion of the collection and disbursement being considered as a possible contractor. And I do have other amendments that would
