SENATOR BROWN: I'm not...I can only speculate on why the Treasurer would want it. As I understand it, his...one of his concerns is that this is state money and that if he is not responsible for receipting it and investing it and managing it, that it sets a precedent that other agencies of the state might want to take money off budget. Now I view this as a very distinct situation. It is not money that is in any way, shape or form the state's money, but I...but I will tell you that the county people talk about it in terms of they're having the money to be able to invest in local banks and draw interest on and then there's also the issue has been made that the state with prudent investing will then be able to draw interest. That interest, as far as I can tell, would be...would offset the federal...some of the federal money that we receive so that we wouldn't actually be making money, but it's a money-management issue largely that I think is motivating the Treasurer. The concern is that because the Treasurer has not seen an RFP, there is not an RFP yet done. Now at my request, they did do sort of a breakdown of all the things that are required of a centralized disburse...collection and disbursement unit just so that there would be a better understanding of the scope of what is required here. And right now, Ron Ross, from...the Director of Health and Human Services, Services Division is probably meeting with the Treasurer to talk through those points, but I'm not certain that the Treasurer fully understands the scope. And so in answer to your second question about the manpower, I am not sure that it's clear right now. But the money that...the money that was going to the clerks...the difference between what has been going to the clerks of the court and will now be going to the clerks of the court would be the money that would be used for the central collection and disbursement unit, and so there is...there is some funding for that, but I don't know if it's going to be sufficient to cover the cost.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Okay, I have one other question, if I have the time. I have been reading the red folder that you gave out from your office concerning this issue. I've been trying to understand it. One of the questions in here is, is the central distribution unit responsible for sending out wage withholding notices? And even though the answer is no, beyond that I don't understand the answer. Could you...
