amendment, this amendment here, but mine doesn't say they may contract with or use the State Treasurer, it says they will enter into an agreement...and the State Treasurer necessary to operate such support collection and disbursement. And it also establishes the Child Support Fund, which is not...there is no fund created in the bill, as such, right now or the amendment. This does create a Child Support Fund. And it also...my amendment then goes on to say that they shall file an annual report with the Legislature, let us know where we are and how we're doing, should this bill pass. So I'm in opposition to the amendment. I will talk more about mine later. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. President, members, I guess I have a question or two for Senator Brown on this, might be dealing with the whole issue. I guess she's going to go up to the mic, Senator Lynch or Senator Robak's.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown?

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Will this cause us to hire a private firm to deal with this or will it be dealt with within the state?

SENATOR BROWN: Well, that's...I set out the three options. With this amendment, a private contractor could not be hired because it requires that the State Treasurer do the receipting and that a governmental entity do the disbursement, and so with this amendment, there would not be...there would not be the option of privatization. Under the green copy of the bill, all the options are still there, and so there would be the option of privatization. But even with privatization under the green copy of the bill, because so many states who have gone into privatization have had customer service problems, the customer service piece of it would be kept within the state so that there would be human beings that you could speak to about problems.
