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the Health and Human Services? Will this create another administrative position with the Health and Human Services?

SENATOR BROWN: The customer service piece of it, yes, does require the hiring of individuals, those people who are going to do the cust...to do the...take the phone calls and respond to the phone calls.

SENATOR SCHMITT: But it wouldn't necessarily be a supervisory position, but it could be?

SENATOR BROWN: No, I don't know...I don't think that there would be supervisory people that...all the people that would be hired would be people who would do direct phone contact and do the research that was necessary to resolve discrepancies.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Okay. I guess that answers my questions. You can have the rest of my time, if you would like to have it, otherwise I will yield it back to the Chair.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Mr. President and members, in response to Senator Schimek...Senator Schimek, in response to the question that you asked, there can...there cannot be multiple points of disbursement unless an exemption is granted and that there is no...that you can still do it, and that the question that would be posed, in terms of asking for an exemption, would be about timeliness. Can you still maintain that two day receipting and disbursement amount and also probably some elements in terms of cost effectiveness. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Your light is next and it is the only light. You can use it to speak or you can use it to close.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm not feeling that we've had sufficient discussion about the relative issues in terms of how to structure the central collection and disbursement unit, and I don't feel comfortable at this point in time in...in going to a vote on this amendment
