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credit for what they've done in the past, is what is known as the goober philosophy. Are potatoes goobers? Does somebody know? Peanuts are goobers. Are pota...what family are potatoes in? Are they fruits or vegetables? Tubers! The tuber fam...the tuber philosophy. Thank you, young Senator Bourne. The tuber philosophy applies to both "Hagging" and Kerrey--the best part of each of them is underground. They have to look to the past, not what they're doing now, because if you judge them by what they're doing now they have gone to sleep or abandoned their post, as I indicated. But we have some minor players, three of them. There's a fellow way out in western Nebraska, so far out there that we don't know whether he belongs to Colorado or Wyoming because you never hear from him, but he used to be in the Legislature and his name was Bill Barrett. He is doing nothing; very quiet, very contented, growing fat as a contented person who eats heavily and does not have to worry about being challenged seriously for his office. So Barrett is not going to rock the boat. You have Douglas Bereuter. Now he has done some good things. When he first went to the U.S. House, he was busy working to help legislators get consideration through the IRS Code based on the inability to get adequate salary and things of that nature. So he did do some things with reference to the Tax Code...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to assist legislators. But on this issue, where is Douglas? They cannot find him. He is traveling somewhere. Nobody knows where he is. We have another one, Lee Terry, Junior, from Omaha, and he's confused as to whether he's for term limits or not. Even though he said he would limit his term, he's not sure now whether he's going to do that. So the three "juniors" are either traveling, resting, or confused. And what becomes of the state of Nebraska? I will continue that the next time I'm called on to speak.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, your light is on next on the bracket motion to LB 637.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Continuing along
