SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: It...I...our office has been told in the case of insufficient funds, when there would be a check of insufficient funds, that the state in fact will cover that cost. Could you tell me in your research the total amount of money in the state of Nebraska that would qualify or that per month happens, instances of insufficient funds.

SENATOR BROWN: Within the Child Support Division?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes.

SENATOR BROWN: The Child Support people have estimated that it would be one-tenth of one percent that would...that they would need to go to collection on.

SENATOR BOHLKE: So what's the total amount of child support payments a month?

SENATOR BROWN: About \$120 million.

SENATOR BOHLKE: A hundred and twenty million? So that would mean twelve million and one-tenth of...

SENATOR BROWN: One...one-tenth of one percent.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...one percent would be...

SENATOR BROWN: A hundred and twenty thousand.

SENATOR BOHLKE: A month.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And so is that reflected in the fiscal note?

SENATOR BROWN: But that...that would be going to collection. The collection rate is fairly high on that, but, no, that is not reflected in the fiscal note.
