we're going to lose \$15 million or \$58 million or anything else. And if anyone else would have any, you know, any discussion on this, I...I think we're overlooking this. The way I read it, I'm no legal mind, but it looks to me like this is an out for states who already have a system like this up. And it certainly wouldn't take very long to link those...those clerks of the district court together, because I'm sure that they go back and forth now. It shall have one cent...and, all right, then it goes on to say that, in addition, employers shall be given one location to which income withholding is sent, one location. That's fine. The clerk of the district court, one location, and it can be given to whatever county you're in, the way I read it. Now, Senator Brown, if you would like to elaborate on that or if you can tell me why you don't think that would work.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown, would you yield?

SENATOR BROWN: Yes. I'm sorry, you'll have to repeat...

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR BROWN: ...the issue.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'm looking at the Welfare Reform Act, in Section 454(b). It's on collection and disbursement of support payments and in number 3 in that section. I'll read it to you again: The state disbursement unit may be established by linking local disbursement units throughout an automated information network subject to this section, if the secretary agrees that the system will not cost more nor take more time to establish and operate than a centralized system. All right, it gives you an option, the way I read it. In addition...

SENATOR BROWN: Absolutely, and that's exactly what we've been talking about in terms of a waiver. You cannot...you cannot have more than one place for wage withholding. There has to be a central unit for...one single place for wage withholding to be sent. And when you take wage withholding, which is about 50 percent of the amount, out then that makes it pretty...
