about child support. This does not improve child support collection. It will probably do great deal...do a great of harm to poor women and children because it will make it more difficult to get their child support. And I would...I would support the bracket motion and I would ask my colleagues to support the bracket motion and do some work on how it is that we do a better job in collecting child support and also begin to recognize the humanity of poor women and children, which this is supposed to be all about. And I would yield the remainder of my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Kiel. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, why am I focusing on the representatives in Washington? Because sometimes there might be a tendency to forget why they were sent to Washington. Although the totality...the Senate consists of the totality of all of the members, each state sends two senators to the U.S. Senate. Each state sends varying numbers to the House, because that representation is based on population, as we know. For every 435,000 people in a state, that state will send a representative to the House. Currently, Nebraska has three people in the House; two in the Senate. When they run for those offices, they come to Nebraska and they give glowing stories of what they have done and equally glowing promises of what they intend to do in the future. So maybe they will talk to some agency about releasing some funds to help...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...build some housing and little things like that, and I say "little" compared to the bigger issues. When we come to a matter of this magnitude that we're confronting today with LB 637, you don't hear a peep from any of them. They're all traveling. They're all gone. And then they want to pretend, if Exxon was speaking for all of them, that this is something created by the Legislature. That is not right and that is what I'm going to continue to hammer, along with other things.
