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and whether this bill is in accord with that. I was talking with Mr. Wusk this morning and he had said something about you have to centralize withholding, but if...and, as Senator Brown pointed out, if that's going to take more than 50 percent of the cases, it wouldn't be cost effective to not centralize the rest. But, see, what was presented to us is that everything has got to be centralized and there cannot be anything "waiverable". But if you pin him right down he'll acknowledge that there is no mandate that everything be centralized, but he argued that you could not show that it would be cost effective to not centralize the rest of it if you're going to centralize the wage withholding. But, see, that's not what they said. There is no waiver of any kind available, period. Then he wanted to tell me that those people who were dissatisfied with the way the study had been taken...undertaken in connection with that task force that we've mentioned from time to time, he' saying that the ones who don't like the way the study was completed or what the study said are mistaken; that they say certain information was not utilized but, in fact, it was. That's not what emerged during the hearing at the Judiciary Committee when those people would have been there to counteract what Mr. Wusk is saying now. But what I would like to ask Senator Brown, and if she could answer at Senator Redfield's microphone it would save time, Mr. President, Mr. President, I'm going to ask Senator Brown a question but she's at Senator Redfield's mike, to save her from having to run all the way back.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brown, what...the report that was written, who wrote a report as a result of the task force activity? Who was the actual person who wrote that?

SENATOR BROWN: There are two reports. There was one from the Bureau of Business Research on the study that was done, and then there was a report by the facilitator of the task force, Judge Van Pelt.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What, Judge Van Pelt? He was not a member of the task force, was he?
