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SENATOR HARTNETT: What do you mean minimal sanctions?

SENATOR BROWN: Well, the sanctions that we are receiving for that are not the same as the sanctions we would receive for not being...for not having a central disbursement unit.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Can...can the state mandate the largest county to get on board?

SENATOR BROWN: Well, there are options that are being worked on right now. They will need to come onto the system or they will face losing the federal money that pays for 66 percent of their costs.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And so they seem to be willing to do. Okay. Thank you. Senator Chambers, if you'd like my time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, as I was going to say when my time ran out the last time, this...this plan or program that LB 637 is offering to us is not offered and it is not mandated by the federal government because it's going to improve the situation relative to child support collection. The Speaker yesterday had to acknowledge that whether it's good or bad is beside the point; it is a budget issue. It is more than that to me. I will never avert my eyes from the women and children who will be affected by what we do. Right now, people who have to deal with some of these bureaucracies are treated very rudely, they are not given timely answers or information when they need it, and I can just imagine what is going to happen when you have employees being required to do far more than they can ever hope to do. I think there will be abruptness, there will be rudeness, there might even be profanity. People may have the phone hung up on them, especially if the employee is of the opinion that the person at the other end of the line doesn't have much clout. We can say all we want to, that 14 people are going to be the best in the world, that they're never going to do any of the things that I'm mentioning, but those who have had experience in dealing with the public are aware of how
