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effective, not effective enough, but somewhat effective? I'm pleased with the way that we've been able to increase child support collections in the state, but I still think that we have a long way to go. Or do we want to come up with the money out of the state...out of our state funds, the \$15 million, and start figuring out how we're going to come up with the \$58 million that we will lose next year in TANF funds, so that we can maintain a system so that, in absolute opposition to what Senator Chambers has been saying, we can continue to protect the women and children in this state? Are we going to force our counties to eat the \$15 million? Those are the questions we have to ask ourselves. We have to quit reaching for straws and pretending that this is not the situation that it is, not the situation that has been shown in the federal legislation. Let me tell you how serious the Congress is about this. Because all the states were complaining, because states like Ohio, that lost the \$12 million, was complaining,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...the Congress got back together and reaffirmed this welfare reform legislation. Now, for some of those people it may have been that they just wanted to be able to reduce welfare rolls. But I hope and I believe that for a lot of the people the motivation was the same as it is for many of us on the floor of the Legislature today, that they wanted more children to receive the support that they deserved, so that they would not have to be a part of the welfare system, so that they would not have to be dependent on government to support them when they had parents that could support them. And so the Congress absolutely believes in this legislation, believes that this kind of a system is going to make it better for us...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR BROWN: ...to collect child support across the nation. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I withdraw my bracket motion.
