seems to understand, what we are doing, we are willingly saying that we are going to continue to do child support, probably not as well, but we are going to continue to do child support without the assistance of the federal government, then as long as we know that, then I will withdraw this amendment and move on to the Bohlke amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is withdrawn. We are back for further discussion on the Bohlke amendment. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, I'm going to be very brief so as not to be an obstruction on this issue. I'm going to support Senator Bohlke's amendment so we can move it forward to Select File. I just want to say the previous administration, the present administration have worked together recently. The previous administration worked for two years to get a waiver. There's been a lot of spade work done. And so my personal thought is that this is probably going to be an exercise in futility. But, for the sake of consensus and compromise and advancement, I'll support the bill as amended, if this particular amendment passes. And we'll see what happens on Select File. But I think it needs to be recognized there's been lots of work been done thus far in trying to find a common ground with the feds, trying to find a waiver, trying to find a satisfactory solution. It has not been forthcoming. Perhaps we can try another time, for the next two weeks, if that be what it be, but I think that effort has to be recognized, up until now both previous administration and the present administration. And, with that, I will support Senator Bohlke's amendment and wait, I guess, for Select File.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Schimek, on the Bohlke amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Originally, I was not going to support the Bohlke amendment, but I have changed my mind and decided to, for the sake of moving this bill over to Select File, because I think we have to be very cognizant of the time that we have left in this session. After having some lengthy discussions out in the Rotunda, with the people in the department who are in charge of
