these child support collections, I am absolutely convinced that we do not have any choice, and I have also been told that we will be sanctioned, whether we pass this bill or not. However, however, if we are in the process of implementing, it will go much more favorable in an almost certain appeal process that we will also be doing. So I am convinced that we have to do this. But I have also been instructed that we maybe have a little bit of wiggle room in some of these provisions, not about who collects, but in some of the other provisions. I think that a group could sit down together before Select File and come back with some provisions that might be somewhat, not a lot, but somewhat more palatable to the body, and that is the reason that I'm going to support the Bohlke amendment and move this bill over to Select File, with the understanding that additional work will be done on this bill between now and then. I'm absolutely convinced we have to do it. I don't think we have any choice. And, with that, I would yield the rest of my time back to the Chair.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Brown, on the Bohlke amendment.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'll just say ditto to what Senator Schimek just said and will, with a great deal of misapprehension, go ahead and support the Bohlke amendment. I will not vote for it, but I will say that it...that we go ahead and do it and move the bill on to Select File.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Discussion on the Bohlke amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in politics you look at results. Whatever anybody's motivation is for voting for this amendment is all right with me. I would like to see the amendment adopted. I think those who are favoring LB 637 know the bill is terribly wounded, very vulnerable, it is weak. It cannot go in the form that it's in. So I'm not getting everything, and the others who are supporting the amendment are not giving up really anything. They have this alternative, leave 637 stuck on General File for the rest of the session. I just want to bring things into sharp focus so that
