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passed this out a few moments ago and it is a case status report from the Attorney General's Office, and if you'll take a few moments to page through it, you will find three and, in some cases, not all cases, three and four pages, in some cases dating back to 1979, 1980, of scrupulously precise review by the courts. I think these people, the ten that are now sitting on death row and probably there's one of whom we spoke of last year, the last gentleman named, Clarence Victor, who probably will never serve...solve...pardon me, never be executed by virtue of the same circumstances that Senator Matzke spoke of on Simpson, and that is of mental capacity. The point is, these people have had their case scrupulously reviewed. Senator Brashear says there's 165 first degree murders here in Lincoln among us, 10 of which are on death row. I don't know how many are black, how many are white, what their race is. I know that of the people on death row, 80 percent are white. That's really not the point. The point is these people have been justly tried, justly convicted, justly sentenced to death, and they have had every aspect of their case carefully reviewed by court after court, not Nebraska courts. Some of these have been to the United States Supreme Court, the Circuit Court of Appeals, Federal District Court commonly, the Nebraska Supreme Court. There is no doubt, I think, in anyone's mind, including Senator Chambers, that these people committed the crime for which they have been sentenced to death. His argument is with the sentence, not the circumstances, I believe, of the crime, but he can address that. Senator Chambers brought up that European nations have done away with the death penalty. Israel is one. Now, of course, Israel also had assassination teams, outfitted and trained by the Mossad, out taking care of their enemies where they found them--Switzerland, France, Germany. They finally got caught at it up in, I believe, Norway number of years ago. But even Israel, when they finally got their hands on Adolph Eichmann, in face of their law prohibiting the death penalty, abrogated that law, passed a special circumstance law, and hanged a man who, while he was responsible for the death of at least hundreds of thousands, had never himself killed, actually killed one. He had ordered, he had expedited, he had facilitated, but he never pulled the trigger himself.
