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right time to talk about this, but I...I want to rise and tell you what...what the ethanol production in my part of the state has done, the impact on the communities surrounding Blair, Nebraska, where Cargill has their ethanol plant. I've watched that grow from the beginning, watched what...the products that are coming out of that...out of that plant and the involvement of other companies within Cargill and that have come in and joined with them. Not only domestic but also foreign companies have come in and, with a joint venture with Cargill, have made that plant grow. They are...they will be working on that plant and adding to it into the future, and who knows how far into the future. It seems to me that when Cargill came in they bought something like 800 acres of land in the Missouri bottom. It's been beneficial to the city of Blair. It is growing by leaps and bounds. They have a good school system, a good market. Housing is growing, and not only...not only in Blair but the surrounding communities. And I've watched some of the things that they make every day. All day long, these trucks, the semi-tractor trailers will come through the town that I live in, Nickerson, carrying what they call...it's what's left over out of the corn that is being shipped to cattle feeders in eastern Nebraska, and there's a waiting list. There's a waiting list for people to get on to feed this to their cattle. It has taken about two-thirds less roughage that the farmers have to put up in...to feed their cattle in the wintertime. Been a great, great product for cattle feeders throughout eastern Nebraska. I might add that there really is not enough corn in eastern Nebraska or surrounding Blair, Nebraska, to keep the plant in production. I can't remember exactly what the percentage is, but it's a large percentage of corn that has to come from the state of Iowa, so they can keep the plant going. And I mean, and it could have been built in Iowa too, but it was built in Nebraska. Some of the things that...that are being manufactured now, one of the big things is the corn sweetener. They have these 5,000 gallon tankers that leave that plant round the clock with the sweetener that goes into the...Coca Cola is one of their big...one of their big customers, used in a sweetener for the soda. Plastics, wheat...or the oil, corn oil comes out of the wheat germ. And if any of you have ever...have ever been around a plant like this one, where they make all these different things, it's remarkable. I love to go back there every year and just watch and see what new is happening at this
