PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: There are...there is going to be a time when...when they're...I'm afraid they're going to run out of labor, people in...very good jobs, high-paying jobs. They're not...the benefits are great, a good company to work for. I don't think there...hardly ever do I hear of anybody that is leaving, is leaving that plant and looking for employment elsewhere. Their turnover is very small. That just goes to show you what kind of...what kind of operations we do have in this state and we can be grateful that they chose to...to move to Nebraska and invest their money here. I can't say enough for the ethanol production in this state, something that we've looked forward to, and anything we can do to enhance that I will certainly be in favor of. Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Further discussion on the committee amendments to LB 605? Senator Beutler, followed by Stuhr, Don Pederson, Wehrbein, Coordsen, and Redfield.
