County's production. Ag Processors, AGP in Hastings, 14..14 million bushel of corn. There's more corn and milo processed in Hastings than Adams County can produce. This is impacting the market and I think it behooves us to keep these people strong. Now the question Senator Beutler raises, and it's a fair question, you know, do we need to use this money when we could be using it for some other place as far as...as far as buying market share, I believe trying to buy market share in Nebraska is futile. I'm disappointed in the ag community for not utilizing the ethanol production more in their pickups and cars. Pretty near all the field vehicles you see are diesel engines. I'm disappointed in that. I don't know what to do about that. But I believe what this bill...about is producer credits. Nebraska doesn't even have 1 percent of the United States population. We are producing ethanol for markets outside of Nebraska. That's what it's all about. I wish we could get our market share higher. I'm not willing to spend the money for that. I would rather keep the ethanol plants we have healthy. I would rather use it for expanded production and I think the future for ethanol is tremendous. And this is a subsidy, but, make no mistake about it, there's probably no industry more subsidized in this nation than the oil industry. What was the Gulf War about? It was about subsidizing the oil industry. I didn't see the oil industry pay the bill for that war. We, as taxpayers, paid that bill. It cost a lot of money. And that war wasn't about human rights; it was about oil production. There would be no war. We wouldn't be a...we wouldn't have a presence over there if it wasn't for the oil over there. We're importing half of our energy needs when it comes to liquified petroleum products. This is a way to make us less dependent on other countries for our energy production. I would ask you to vote down the committee amendments and vote for the Stuhr amendments as they come forward. A lot of us have worked hard on this. I know it's confusing and those of us who have worked hard on this haven't agreed on everything, but we've agreed that we need an ethanol bill this year, we need...we need some incentives out there for some new production and, in another year or two, we'll have time to evaluate this program and take additional correctional steps.
