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SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but one entity gets the 70 percent. When are you all going to wake up? Never. You won't, because the wolf is not sitting on your doorstep right now. But I know what's going to happen. When I first came down here, I described things that would happen in agriculture, I even talked about the confinement feeding of hogs. I talked about that when I ran for Governor, decades ago. And I talked about the proliferation of these operations. But since I don't grow hogs, but only ate pork chops, I couldn't know what I was talking about. Farm people, in some cases, are so myopic, they see to the end of their nose, if they see that far. And you know why I say this? I don't even care if they're offended, all they need to do is read the record and see who is more correct. I was more correct, that's why I wouldn't be on a farm, because I can see the trends, and I'm also not sentimental about it. Sentiment is not going to cut the mustard. If enough states get together to do something...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for a while, smaller farms can continue to exist.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Raikes, on the Dierks amendment.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I've been listening to Senator Chambers. He has some really very good insights about the structure of agriculture and the trends that are underway. I think the main point he wanted to make, though, that he didn't get a chance to get to was to endorse the idea that I offered, that we need to incorporate technology in agriculture, in particular the exchange mechanism. I would like to emphasize that once again. I think he's absolutely correct that, if production agriculture continues to do things the way that they've always done it, the future is indeed bleak. One opportunity, at least, is for them to be among the leaders in adopting new technology. I think it's a very vital role for the state to be a facilitator in that effort. And one place that we have a good opportunity to start is in exchange and price-making
