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fall away from it at this point. Not only should it pass, but it should pass with an overwhelming vote. What do I think is an overwhelming vote? From my position an overwhelming vote is 25 to 24. But, because the rest of the world is used to a more bountiful harvest than I am, an overwhelming vote should be about 50 to nothing. But since we only have 49 members, young Senator Bourne, we'll take 48 to 2...no, 48 to 1. (Laugh) Some nodded agreement with me. I think people are just kind of out of it now. Some of the things that I'm saying, they're for the record, because in the same way in the past that I put things in the record that I could pull out a decade later and say, I'm not just saying I said it, here it is on the record. So I want this that I'm saying to be a matter of record. And I wish that there were some way to get those in agriculture to wake up and see the Farm Bureau for what it is. It escapes my ability to understand my colleagues in the rural and farm community who think that the Farm Bureau is their salvation. Now if you run a corporate farm or you intend to start a corporation somewhere and then bring it in here, when all these little family farms...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...are gobbled up, then go for the Farm Bureau. But for the life of me, I don't understand that. What I have been tempted to do, except that I have too much integrity, is to take advantage of that same naivete and try to sell some of my colleagues seeds which, when you plant them, will grow into a beanstalk that will go all the way up to the sky, on top of which is a castle, resided in by a giant who has a goose that lays golden eggs. But I have a little too much integrity at this point for that.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, on the Dierks amendment to the Wehrbein amendment. Senator Wehrbein waives off. There are no more lights on. Senator Dierks, did you wish to close on your amendment to the Wehrbein amendment?

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I guess that I will close by saying I hope you'll accept this amendment and this amendment to the amendment, and also the amendment, and let's get on with the bill. Thank you.
