SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh.

SENATOR DIERKS: ...there was another amendment that was drafted. I think Senator Wehrbein had the other amendment, but that in...and then mine included the E clause, yeah. I think the bill we dealt with...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then...

SENATOR DIERKS: ...was withdrawn by Senator Brashear, and the other bill we dealt with then was submitted by Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Oh, I'm on your time. I'll have to wait until I...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: We're on Senator Dierks' time, sir.

SENATOR DIERKS: Oh, that's fine.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, Senator Chambers of course is burrowing in on one of my favorite subjects, and we both have difficulties with the...with the effect that the corporate packers have had on the producers out here. And it's difficult for us to give an inch as far as getting relief from anything we're trying to do. And so when I had the opportunity to do a little negotiating, and I got the E clause put on, I thought that this was...we actually gave away about 40 days, maybe 45, as far as the time frame is concerned on reporting, and I thought I could live with that, if we got the E clause passed. Thank you.
