PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. LB 822.

CLERK: Mr. President, when the Legislature recessed, Senator Schimek had offered AM1171. That amendment is before us, Mr. President. I have amendments to that amendment. Senator Schimek has the first, AM1283, as an amendment to the amendment. (AM1171, Legislative Journal page 1386, and AM1283, Legislative Journal page 1506.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. If we could have everyone's attention, please. Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. This is what I would call a clarifying amendment. It simply makes clear that this does not allow a county who already has a zoning...has zoning in place to do interim zoning. And the question was raised with me after the amendment was circulated, and I thought that it probably was good to clarify, even though the intention certainly never was that you could go to interim zoning if you had already zoned. So, that's all this amendment does. I'd be happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Is there any discussion on the Schimek amendment to AM1171? Seeing no lights, Senator Schimek, you're recognized to close. Senator Schimek waives closing. The question before us is the adoption of the Schimek amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. We're voting on the Schimek amendment. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Schimek's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Mr. Clerk.
