SENATOR CHAMBERS: Some people call it the stocks. That's where you're out there and the people can do anything they want to. They can throw rocks at you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and whatever.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, members, I rise in support of the Kremer amendment. It's been an interesting issue facing the Government Committee and I've probably not received more mail on any other issue but this one, and I believe that we have zoning in our counties and cities and other political subdivisions so that we can be proactive in shaping the counties according to a comprehensive plan. And I believe that interim zoning, even though I'm willing to support this amendment, I think interim zoning can be oftentimes targeted at one company, one individual, when that's not the purpose. And so I think this is a very reasonable compromise. Senator Schimek mentioned swallowing hard. I think there are a lot of people swallowing hard at this one. And I just want to point out that we can do all we want here, but the zoning, be it interim or long-term, must take place at the county level and I really suggest that...that we really think hard about this, and I do recommend voting in favor of the Kremer amendment. Thank you.
