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be nothing done by way of zoning with these facilities simply because the state said that they could be expanded or they could or could not exist in a particular place other than what the language directly dictates.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler, and I...I'm going to I guess continue to think about the concept that we're...that we're doing here, and I have been...I have been supportive of protecting these streams. But as I get into it, I want to be sure that...that it isn't adequate to protect these streams through the processes that we have now and that we need to take this special action singling out the geographical area or areas of the state and saying these are going to be treated differently, and if...and if that's justified. I certainly have an acquaintance who was fined \$10,000 for waste getting into a stream that probably...I know it never had a trout, and I don't even know if it had a bullhead, but waste got into the stream, and it was not a pristine stream, and it was a \$10,000 fine. Now I don't know why DEQ can't apply those standards to any stream in the state.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: And exactly...I guess I want to be sure that we're heading the direction that we want to head here. We've bent over backwards trying to give people the ability to zone and I support that, but we've got DEQ to protect the environment and we've got the counties to protect the land use regulation, and this is an exception to that general course that we have taken for the last 30 years. So we need to...we need to recognize that. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Schrock, there are no further lights on besides your own. Would you like to close on this or would you like to speak here?
