none of it in our water. I use that just as an illustration. But now are the things that are listed here, is that what they are going to test for, or do you anticipate that they will...it also says: but not limited to, you know, so you could...they could be testing for other things too. Do you foresee that they could start testing for other things they don't need to be testing for, or is there a safeguard there that we don't spend a lot of money on testing things we don't need to?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, I think that's a valid question because in the drinking water, the Federal Drinking Water Act, they went way overboard, at least in my opinion. But the money that they have available for lab tests may not even go far enough to test these particular items that we've identified here, which I think everybody would agree on are our problem elements. And so unless the money came from someplace else, they wouldn't be able to test it. But their general authority that's already in law, Senator, is that they can test for more things if they wanted to. What I was trying to do, because there was certain things that were very important that they have not tested for a number of years now simply because they didn't have the money and the federal money left, and so there was no testing for the nitrate, different kinds of nitrate compounds and phosphorous. I just wanted to name those items so that those things were covered and that there was money, hopefully, to cover those things. But there is no money to cover anything else, but even...even if there...I mean so the only thing they could do would be to shift money from someplace else, but they could do that now, if they wanted to, in other words.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I...thank you very much, Senator Beutler. I just...I hope that we're not opening the door. I plan on supporting this, Senator Beutler, but I just want to be a little cautious when...when we approach this so we're not opening the door for another, let's say, boondoggle where they come in and just get carried away on some of their testing. I don't want that to happen, and I wanted this on the record that we did talk about that, and thank you very much, and I'll give the rest of my time back to Senator Beutler, if he would like to have it.
