PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jones. Seeing no other lights, Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close on behalf of Senator Bohlke on AM1147.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, and, again, this changes the POP provisions to try to make them more functional with the rest of the statutes. It does allow that person to test within 60 days prior to their birth date, and so...and the rest of the provisions are, I would say, more harmonizing with the rest of the DMV statutes. There are no real policy changes. So I would ask your support on the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question is the adoption of AM1147 to LB 704. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Mr. Clerk,

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Hartnett.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Hartnett, you're recognized to open on LB(sic)1112.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President and members of the body, since I introduced this amendment. I have had contact with Senator Bromm and also with the Department of Motor Vehicles and my concerns are being addressed, so I simply would withdraw this amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.
