SENATOR C. PETERSON: Yes, it was, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And where is that bill now?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: It is on General File. It was advanced unanimously from the committee.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And nobody made it a priority bill,...

SENATOR C. PETERSON: No, they did not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...obviously? The committee did not?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: No, they did not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The Speaker did not?

SENATOR C. PETERSON: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, and I hope you don't take anything personally, Senator Peterson, because you're not going to be with us much longer and you won't have a chance to get back at me next session. But, members of the Legislature, as I look at this what the commission is to do, I can certainly understand why the insurance people would be for it. The more people that have to be insured, the more money the insurance agents are going to make. They sell insurance. It's obvious that they would be for it. What this commission will do, if you look at page 1, in line 16, they may address and enhance safety issues, which means they can run after points, they can run after reducing the speed limits, increasing fines, and all of these other things which I am not in favor of having a commission be authorized to do. Now there have been some initiatives attempted by the Legislature, which I agreed with. One is that Women's Health Initiative. That was given a debate on General File. I am not sure that this matter has been debated on General File. Maybe it has been and I'll ask, is Senator Bromm here because Senator Peterson is occupied? Senator Bromm, has this bill been discussed on General File, the one that the amendment is...oh, I see Senator Peterson is back.
