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we thought it was worthwhile to check out. And of course, if we are contaminating the groundwater with petroleum-based fuels the corn oil and the soybean oil is certainly a preferred alternative, because it would not be a contaminant like a petroleum-based product. That's the essence of the study, and the essence of the legislation. If there's any questions, I'd be glad to try and answer that.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schrock. For discussion on the committee amendments to LR 22, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, a question, Senator Schrock and then Senator Coordsen, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schrock, would you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Schrock, you mentioned \$40,000. I have here our original bill was \$10,000.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Wehrbein, it's thought that's what the study would cost, and the University and the committee felt like they could put in a funding request from the Soybean Board and the Corn Checkoff Board to handle the rest of it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Now, that may not happen.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So there's...the indication of \$10,000 General Fund is all that you're looking at from your...?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. And then, Senator Coordsen, please.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes.
