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into, well, I just want to talk about the school lands just a little bit, because right now the rent that's being paid out there comes down to the administration and they send money back in lieu of tax. Can they stop that in lieu of tax and pick up this tax for the real estate for that so the school lands and funds would have to send real estate tax back to the counties and then that would cause the schools to lose money because they was getting all of that in lieu of where they're only going to get a portion of it now? The in lieu probably figures out just about the same as real estate tax will, but now, all of a sudden, we're going to have just a regular tax go back out there. And I'm really supportive of the idea that the counties is going to get something out of this school land, because they never have before. Just schools have had it. But it actually will lower the dollars the schools will get out there. And with that, I would like to ask Senator Kristensen one question along this line.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes?

SENATOR JONES: Did you follow what I was talking about, Senator Kristensen?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I must apologize to you, Senator Jones. I was talking to staff.

SENATOR JONES: I was talking about the school land that comes in...you know, that's in lieu of tax being paid out there right now for. So this would replace it, so then the schools would actually get less dollars, because the same...about the same amount of tax will go out as the in lieu was. Is that right?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Well, I think that's correct. And now you're going to tax my memory of my Revenue Committee days. But I believe that to be accurate. Yes.

SENATOR JONES: Yes. And then I wanted to ask you one more question on your date change. It really affects your personal property tax that you filed too, because you always...you got to have it in there by the first of May, but you got to...whatever you have to have on January 1 is what you're being paid on...would have to pay on.
