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to recognize that because even though the voters indicated this was their desire...I think somebody indicated it, and it's true, they didn't say you had to do it immediately. And this is certainly, as has been expressed by some other speakers, a very complicated issue that needs to be dealt with very cautiously and I think we need to take the time to do that so that we, in fact, do the right thing. And so, without taking up a lot of time, I just want to lend my support to the Kristensen amendment on this particular piece of legislation. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Cudaback on the Kristensen amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President and members, I just much has been said probably and so I don't need to reiterate everything, but Senator Wickersham has an obligation here and the people have spoken, and I appreciate the fact that he is pushing this LB 271 because he has to. But I think there are a lot of unknowns, and I guess I'm scared of the unknowns. I think we tell our assessors many times to do this, do that. We tell them before we actually know what's going on. I think that Kristensen's amendment will probably will give us that time needed to experience. I know Senator Wickersham says what do you do, you can't have a trial run, but maybe we can come up with some way to measure what might be going on and the ramifications of the unknowns. So I just to say that a lot of stuff here and we all...it raises a red flag in my particular...my district, your district. We all have an interest in this. And before we do something, it's very tough to take it off. Like Senator Kristensen said, it's very difficult to undo something that you do. So before we do this, which we have to do, like Senator Wickersham said, but let's just give it a little more time here to say, hey, I told you so. So I do support the Senator Kristensen amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Kristensen.
