respond. With that, I would propose that we approve the amendment by Senator Kristensen. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Pederson. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Madam President, members. For the record, I just want to clarify that I certainly do not expect each of my prior concerns to be outlined in statute. That is certainly not my intent. It's just the fact that I raised some questions and I believe that we can address those concerns and questions in a fashion that is good policy, that works well with local governments and makes sure that there is a level playing field and that everyone can expect that level playing field. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Smith. There are no further lights. Senator Kristensen, would you like to close on your amendment?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Part of the Wickersham AM1465 has an operative date of January 1, the year 2000. My amendment to that amendment moves it back one day. That one day just means the operative date of LB 271 does not apply to property taxes that are assessed in the year 2000. They would apply to assessments of properties in the year 2001. So it is is a delay of the operative provisions of this bill so it doesn't occur next year. I would ask for its adoption.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Kristensen amendment to the Wickersham amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Kristensen amendment. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 6 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment to the...
