SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. There are no further lights. Senator Wickersham, would you like to close on your amendment. He waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment to LB 271. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.
