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Is it your intent that both the owner and the beginning farmer receives the equivalent of that credit?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, they would have to share that.

SENATOR REDFIELD: So they would each get 2 1/2 percent.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, they might have some agreement for sharing that. I think that is another important point. I don't know how the benefit is going to be shared between the landlord and the tenant but they are going to have to work out some arrangement for that. If their arrangement is that all of it goes to the landlord, that's...that's their agreement.

SENATOR REDFIELD: I see. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Discussion on AM1478, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members, I would like to ask Senator Wickersham a question before I totally vote against...or, (laugh) work against his amendment. How...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...do you perceive this working? I did...I was going to ask you about how that's to be divided. The 5 percent would be a negotiable effort between the lessor and the lessee.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And would there be a direct check out of the fund that you're creating?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And so it'd amount to a direct payment to either or both...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.
