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working on it in between General File and now, so I'm not going to say a whole lot, but I wish there were a way to structure this so that there would be a little bit more direct, assurance of direct benefit to the beginning farmer and I think we ought to continue to think about that. But I would support making this available, if we do...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...it, either on a cash rent or a share crop basis, and I think we can do that with appropriate language in Senator Wehrbein's bill. I do not think it should require strictly a cash rent arrangement because that's something that a lot of times beginning farmers have a great difficulty with, is obligating themselves to a lot of cash rent. For one thing, the farmer or the owner is a little skeptical of renting to them, wondering if they will have the financial wherewithal to make that cash rent payment. And, secondly, it's hard for the banker to like that for a beginning farmer. So I would hate to see it restricted to a cash rent basis, so I'm probably going to vote against the Wickersham amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Wehrbein, on the Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: One of the reasons that, Mr. Speaker, members, one of the reasons I did delay implementation of this is to have this committee working through some of the details. Now I recognize that you want to go into the details here on the floor, and that's fine, but I do recognize the difficulty of doing that. And one of the reasons that I did delay implementation of this, when I realized there were some questions, that this committee could work with a proposal that would meet with approval of the agricultural community and, ultimately, this Legislature by next year. And if you want to change something in the bill so that there...you feel that we're not moving too fast, too far, I'm willing to accept that. I do understand it's difficult to work out some of these details on the floor, and that is part of the difficulty of arriving at the fiscal note of this. It's really difficult to know how widespread the use will be of this, and it varies by agriculture across the state. Some areas are heavily in cash rent, some
