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pay in rent coming to him by working the farm? Is that how he gets his...?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The rent will be paid by the young farmer to the retiring farmer.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the retiring farmer is still running the farm.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, and he would have...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, he's not...?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I would say have very little to say.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so the young person is now running the farm.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the young...all of the money that's created...generated by the farm belongs to the young person.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: By and large, except for the rental that he would pay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how...what's going to be the difference between the rental that he would pay and the profit that's going to be made?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the profit would have to come from his side of the operation for himself.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, are they going to say that the rental will never be more than a certain percentage of the income produced by this operation?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, a typical rental agreement would either be cash, and I'll just say \$100 an acre for the land, so much a dollar an acre for the feedlot, so much a dollar...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.
