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you logically do?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have four shops, or a shop...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You have four bar...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...with four chairs?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...a four-chair barbershop and there's...you're getting a good payment from a larger operation that wants to come in and do it, versus a young guy come in and say, I want to be a barber and I'd like to hire three more and run this shop and be just like you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If I...if I knew the young person and had some connection to him, then I might give him a break. Otherwise, I'd say business is business and I'm...and, remember, I'm going out of business.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right. Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd sell it where I could get the best price, unless I knew the person.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Well, this is very similar. There are retiring farmers out there that would like to have...give a break to some younger persons in the neighborhood. This is an attempt to "incent" that and having to realize that they're probably going to pass up some opportunities, the cold hard dollar. But there are several, if not many, I don't know that number, that would like to have a young neighbor start in and there are many of those out there. I mean I know many, many people that said, if I could have farmed I would, and they haven't been able to. But there have been opportunities in neighborhoods that this would have been able to work. This simply sets a policy in place at the state of Nebraska that this could work.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Dierks, on the Wickersham amendment to AM1478 to LB 630.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the
