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yes, he could. I don't know, the inheriting 5,000 is what threw me. Actually, if he...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...has a smaller operation and he could tie into a neighboring operation that would make a very viable operation and his business plan would show that it would work,...

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, you got...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I think that's where it would fit.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...you have to understand 5,000 acres where Senator Jones lives is a lot different than 5,000 acres...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...where you live. (Laugh) And so I suppose when you put all of those things into place you'd have to...it would be determined...be determination made by the board that would...would make the consideration. Is that correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Well, I just wanted to get that point on the record because I thought it was something that maybe nobody's even thought about. We're talking about beginning farmers and we're also talking about expanding operations. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, potentially, yes, definitely.

SENATOR VRTISKA: In order to make somebody a viable organization or operation that they could actually succeed on, and I think that's what we're talking about.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR VRTISKA: So I just thought I would...I would put that out. With that, I appreciate your response and I give my time
