Redfield's proposal. So I guess basically it's neutral except for the possibility of increasing the costs, and I don't know how sensitive the body is to that issue. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Further discussion on the Redfield amendment? Seeing none, Senator Redfield, you may close on your amendment.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you. For everyone who expressed a concern as to whether the beginning farmer was going to get any benefit out of this bill I would urge you to look at this, because it's the only proposal we have on the table to give them any kind of incentive to go into farming. I think it is only fair that we give them the same credit that we would give to the owner. I don't believe that it's going to add to the cost of the bill one iota if, in fact, there is no income. And so, if you're concerned about the cost and you're going to tell me that there's no income, I wouldn't worry about it. But if, in fact, it can help them, which is exactly what we've said we wanted to do, there's a very good reason for us to vote for this bill, because we can help them financially. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Redfield. We've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Redfield amendment to LB 630. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Redfield amendment. Have you all voted?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CROSBY: A request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.
