going to benefit the young farmer, and I'm fearful that if the cash rent or...let's just use cash rent because easy to talk about, was \$100, that the cash rent will wind up being \$105 and...and...or it...and in...in that instance there will be...or maybe it will be \$95 and we'll be funding the other \$5 perhaps. I don't know, but I...but I'm just...the operations that are...that are out there, if they don't pass on to a family person, in one way or another are going to go to the highest bidder eventually. I'm just fearful of that. I'm very supportive of trying to do something. I just can't quite put my finger on what it is that we can do, but I don't quite think this is it and so I'm very hopeful that some answers will surface. If we're going to advance the bill rather than work on it more at this stage, that we can find some answers before Final Reading that will make me be able to vote...that will help me vote in support of the bill. I spoke earlier of perhaps doing something with interest with respect to the beginning farmer. The beginning farmer has...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...has to borrow operating money to buy supplies, to buy seed, to buy fertilizer, to buy chemicals, perhaps to buy equipment. He...that person could use some help on the interest that they pay and that would...that would be meaningful and we, in fact, do that now with first-time homeowners. We have a NIFA program that provides a subsidy on interest rate for first-time homeowners. There is some fed...there is a federal program and Federal Land Bank Farm Credit that does provide a little bit of an interest break for first-time farm purchasers, but there is nothing...what I would hope we could do would be to incorporate something for an interest subsidy for perhaps operating loans. I don't think it's possible to redo the bill at this point and I'm not suggesting that I would try to do that. But I'm trying to suggest some ideas that might allow me to support the bill. Thank you.
