SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: House is under call. Would all unexcused members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Roll call vote.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, Senator Brown, would you record your presence, please? Thank you. Senator Schmitt. The house is under call. Senator Chambers, the house is under call. Please report to the Chamber and record your presence. All members are present. There's been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1714-1715.) 32 ayes, 7 nays on the motion.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The germaneness rule is suspended to allow the consideration of the amendment. I raise the call. We're back to debating AM0880. Senator Beutler.
