affiliate or to the educational service unit for assistance.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So we may very well have situations out there where the testing is actually done by the affiliated school as part of their system or process, but then, when it came to reporting it, the affiliated school would have to report it but the Class I would not.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I believe that if they had agreed to all give the same test through the affiliated school district and there was a Class I out there with fewer than ten students, they would not have to.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so part of them would be reporting and part of them would not, under that scenario.

SENATOR BOHLKE: And, as you know, there are not that many Class I's with fewer than ten students, but they are...but they are in existence.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, I wanted to ask you that. It's fewer than ten students in one class. How many districts would there be that had, generally speaking, fewer than ten students in each class? There would be quite a few in that category, would there not?

SENATOR BOHLKE: I'm hesitant to answer that, but I'm thinking of the number of Class I's I'm aware of and there would be a large number who would have fewer than ten.
