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And I'm not a psychiatrist or a psychologist in any way, shape or form, so I'm not diagnosing them. And we ask if they get psychiatric care, and I was out there a few weeks ago and they said, yes, we get psychiatric care. A psychologist or a counselor or a doctor, the inmate didn't know what it was that came down to see them, but came down to talk to them through the hatch 15 minutes a week, through a hatch, and they call that psychiatric care. That's probably the most they can afford, but it sure is not any change. And I think in our part we're saying this is...we're offering something, but then you get out there and look at it and see we're not really offering anything because there's no change in using...doing psychiatric treatment at 15 minutes a week. We have to take a look at what we're spending, what our change is, and what we're getting for our money. We have prisoners who have been in prison three and four times and, just because they've been in prison three and four times, they're automatically classified as maximum security prisoners and they're not even verbally aggressive in some cases. They're not even a threat...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: ...to us physically in any way, shape, or form, but they're automatically classified that, and that's why we're building a third maximum security prison. And you're going to hear about...hear more from me on that prison. It probably won't be today, but it was on that particular prison that we're building. We need the beds. That I've never ever said we don't need. But the kind of beds we're building, do we want the boot camp? I'm just suggesting to you that it's telling you what a boot camp is. Somebody tells you what to do and makes you do it for a few hours a day and if you're a young person and you can get through six months of that, because they plan to rotate twice a month, twice a year, then you can go on about yourself. Is there any real change in that? I don't know. Work release, if it doesn't work, it would still be a place for work release. It's...I would be for doing away with the work camp, but at least keeping somewhere in the area of a work release center where you actually learn to work jobs and put money in your hand and be more responsible.
