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all the details on it because it was two years ago and at that point in time we had all the information in front of us, but I don't have that information now. But it was a good concept then; it's a good concept now. So, as far as going ahead with the work camp, I definitely believe we should. And then another thing, to my good friend, Senator Brown, this wasn't brought up in committee, I don't believe, so it was just brought up here on the floor so...and that's fine. That's what this process is all about. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Engel. Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Certainly statistics, and this is not only true here in Nebraska but across the nation, adult crimes are down and I think this is indicative of some of the numbers that we are seeing, but juvenile crimes are up and we have not kept pace in the past with juvenile corrections, with juvenile services, and I think if we don't take immediate steps there we are going to see our adult numbers increase once more. I certainly would speak for...in favor of Senator Thompson's bill to provide some funds for the YRTC's and hopefully that we can spend more time, more effort, more energy on the youth of this state to help them through the difficulties that they're going through. We do not spend enough time even when we send them to Kearney, send them to Geneva. It's a revolving door. We send them out there. We don't have the time to really spend in rehabilitation, in training. We, too, have in this state some very angry youths that I think can work through some of their problems with the proper guidance and training, and we need to spend more time at that. And if we don't, why, then we're going to see these adult numbers only increase. And so I would really hope that you would spend particular attention to that bill to help with our YRTC's. At the present time we're looking at some cigarette tax money to fund that. I wish that that funding actually could come from the General Fund, but however it comes it is sorely needed and we need to direct our efforts towards that, that end. And then also, through the education process, and I do like what is being done in some of our schools who are working through some of those areas, identifying some of these young people, some of those who are at risk, stepping in and providing guidance and council for those so hopefully that they don't grow
