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to be adult problems and do adult crimes. So, with that, I would urge the body to really direct your efforts towards trying to help the youth of this state, help those who have gone wrong and those that we can help, and then prevent, later on, adult crimes being committed against our citizens. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I support Senator Brown's amendment. I was opposed to that so-called work camp when we were scrambling around here trying to put something together. Then Governor Nelson was engaged in not a great civil war but an uncivil, unnecessary attempt to show that a war was being fought against crime, as it was called. An unnecessary maximum security prison, when that didn't go to McCook, something had to be given to his hometown because, as some of you all may know, he plans to run for the Senate and he's got to mend fences out there. So he will take a political decision in an area, and I don't mean geographic now, speaking of McCook, involving the welfare of our young people. This work camp is a lot of gossamer spun in the air. If we adopt Senator Brown's amendment, it makes available some money to deal with an existing problem at Kearney and Geneva. We had a lot of discussion on her juvenile bill a couple of weeks ago and money was one of the sticking points. There is no work camp constructed. Sending good money after bad is unjustified and it is silly. What is the harm that has befallen this state as a result of this youth, this work camp that was supposed to save the world and bring the second coming of Christ, because the work camp has not been done? What is the harm that has...the state has experienced? Who even knew there was supposed to be a work camp and there is none, consequently we're having all kind of terrible problems? People don't even know about this thing, but it's a good political football and it will help put some money out there in the Governor's former hometown, the former Governor's former hometown. I don't know if he's scuttled back out there to take up residency or not. McCook might be a nice place, Senator Quandahl, to be from, Senator Smith, but to take money that is sorely needed for other things and put it in the ground is not wise spending.
